

Medfusion (“Medfusion”) has created this privacy statement to demonstrate its commitment to privacy. The following discloses the information gathering and dissemination practices for the following website: www.Medfusion.net (“Site”). This Privacy Policy covers Medfusion’s treatment of personally identifiable and non-personally identifiable information that Medfusion collects when users and visitors use this Site (“you”). Except as otherwise required by law, this policy does not cover the practices of companies that Medfusion does not own or control.

Information Automatically Logged

We use your IP address to help diagnose problems with our server and to administer this Site. Your IP address is only used to identify unique visitors when gathering statistics for number of visitors in a given period of time. For each visitor to our Site, our server automatically recognizes only the end user's domain name, but not his or her email address. We collect this information in our server logs and analyze the logs periodically for internal review only. We make no attempt to track domain names back to individuals and store no information in our server logs that would allow us to individually identify visitors to our site.

Cookies

We may save your Client ID and Password in a cookie so that we can verify that you have logged into our Site and have the proper permissions to view the pages you have requested.

Personal Information

On a few areas on our Site, Medfusion may collect personally identifiable information to assist you with services and technical support issues, online account access and payment, or when you register on our Site. In some areas we may request personal information for verification against our records when users request a password online, or wish to make changes to their client records. It is optional for you to receive services requiring such information. Personal information may include, among other things, a user name, address, telephone number, and email address or other Internet address.

The information you provide will be kept confidential and used to support your customer relationship with Medfusion. Agents or contractors of Medfusion who have access to your personal information are required to keep the information confidential and not use it for any other purpose than to carry out the services they are performing for Medfusion. From time to time, we may disclose personally identifiable information to government entities when such disclosure is required by law.

Non-Personally Identifiable Information

In addition to personal information, Medfusion may also gather non-personally identifiable information, which may be used by Medfusion. Generally, “non-personally identifiable information” means information that is collected through “traffic data” and may entail the use of “cookies” or “IP addresses” to identify a computer or monitor how or when a user accesses the Site or communications.
