

# LHC surgeon appointed to international committee

She is a United States Ski and Snowboard Team physician and is board-certified in Orthopedic Surgery and Sports Medicine.

ISAKOS is an international society of surgeons established to advance the worldwide exchange and dissemination of education, research and patient care in arthroscopy, knee surgery and orthopedic sports medicine.

The scientific committee has 17 members who represent countries from around the world.
