How Is the Oxygen Provided?

Compressed Gas

Oxygen can be delivered to your home in the form of a gas in various-sized cylinders. It is stored under pressure with a regulator that controls the flow rate.

Oxygen Concentrator

This is an electrically powered device that separates the oxygen out of the air, concentrates it, and stores it. An oxygen concentrator is not as costly as liquid oxygen and does not require oxygen to be resupplied. You must have a cylinder of oxygen as a backup in the event of a power failure.

What is Home Oxygen?

Home oxygen is provided for patients who may not be getting enough oxygen to their blood. People with asthma, emphysema, chronic bronchitis, lung disease, cystic fibrosis, or congestive heart failure benefit from oxygen therapy at home. This type of oxygen is a pure concentration that is considered a drug and requires prescription by a doctor. Oxygen is not addictive and causes no side effects when used as prescribed. Some people may need supplemental oxygen 24 hours a day, while others may only need oxygen during exercise or sleep.

Delivery may be via:

- Nasal cannula. A two-pronged device inserted in the nostrils, connected to tubing carrying the oxygen. The tubing can rest on the ears or be attached to the frame of eyeglasses.
- Mask. For patients who need a high flow of oxygen.

Oxygen therapy may improve sleep and mood, increase mental alertness, and help other normal body functions.



Home Oxygen Services

- Home delivery and set-up of equipment
- Supply of necessary portable oxygen and refills
- Instruction in use of equipment
- 24-hour emergency services
- Documentation to support medical need, as prescribed by physicians
- Billing to various insurance carriers

Patient Criteria

Oxygen therapy must be prescribed by a physician. The prescription will spell out how much oxygen you need per minute and when you need to use it.

Insurance Coverage

Home oxygen may be partially or completely covered by most insurance plans, including Medicare, when prescribed according to specific guidelines. When these guidelines are not met, oxygen use may not be covered and can be expensive. At your request, our business office would be happy to verify your insurance coverage for you.
