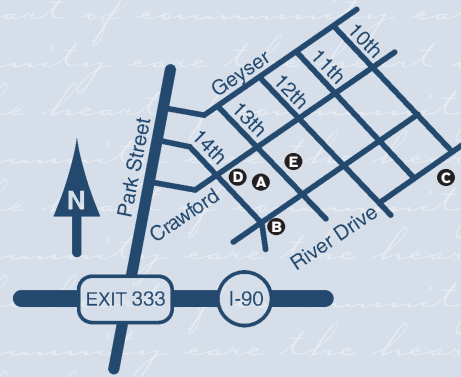


## What to Bring

## Visitors

*Visitors are an important part of the healing process. There are no set visiting hours at the hospital, except as determined by condition of the patient. Visits from persons who are ill are discouraged for the safety of all patients. Children are welcome, but must be accompanied by an adult.*

### Food/Meals

Patient meals are provided with treatment and recovery in mind. Visitors may purchase meals in the hospital cafeteria, located on the lower level. Free coffee, tea, and lemonade, as well as soft drink vending machines, are available there. It is open daily from 8-9:30 am, 12-1 pm, and 5-6 pm.

### Patient Gifts

Patient gifts are always welcome. Special considerations include flowers, which are not allowed in intensive care, food (patients may have special dietary restrictions), or latex balloons (not permitted because of patient allergies).

### Smoking

For your health, Livingston HealthCare is a Tobacco Free Campus. There are no designated smoking areas on Livingston HealthCare property. For safety reasons, during your hospitalization it will not be possible for you to leave our property to use tobacco products. Upon admission, your nurse will discuss nicotine replacement therapy products that are available to make your tobacco-free experience more comfortable.

### Spiritual Care

We believe that emotional and spiritual health is important to healing. Please notify your minister or priest of your hospital stay, if you would like them to visit.

### Cellular Phones

Cell phone usage is limited to certain parts of the hospital, because they may interfere with some medical equipment. Ask your nurse for details.

### Hospital Billing

Most health insurance companies, including Medicare, cover our hospital services. At your request, our business office would be happy to verify your coverage or answer any other billing questions for you.
