

Directions:

The office is located on the 10th floor of the Arnold Building (Suite 1002), 1221 Madison Street, at the corner of Madison and Summit.

From the North, I-5 to Exit 165-A, James. Take a left on James (under freeway). Left on Boren. Right on Madison. 2 blocks to Summit. We are on the corner of Summit and Madison.

From the South, I-5 to exit 164A, Madison. Turn right on Madison, and go uphill 6 blocks to Summit.

From I-90, take the I-5 Northbound exit. Exit to Madison Street staying on freeway exit until you come to Madison, turn right and go uphill 6 blocks to Summit.

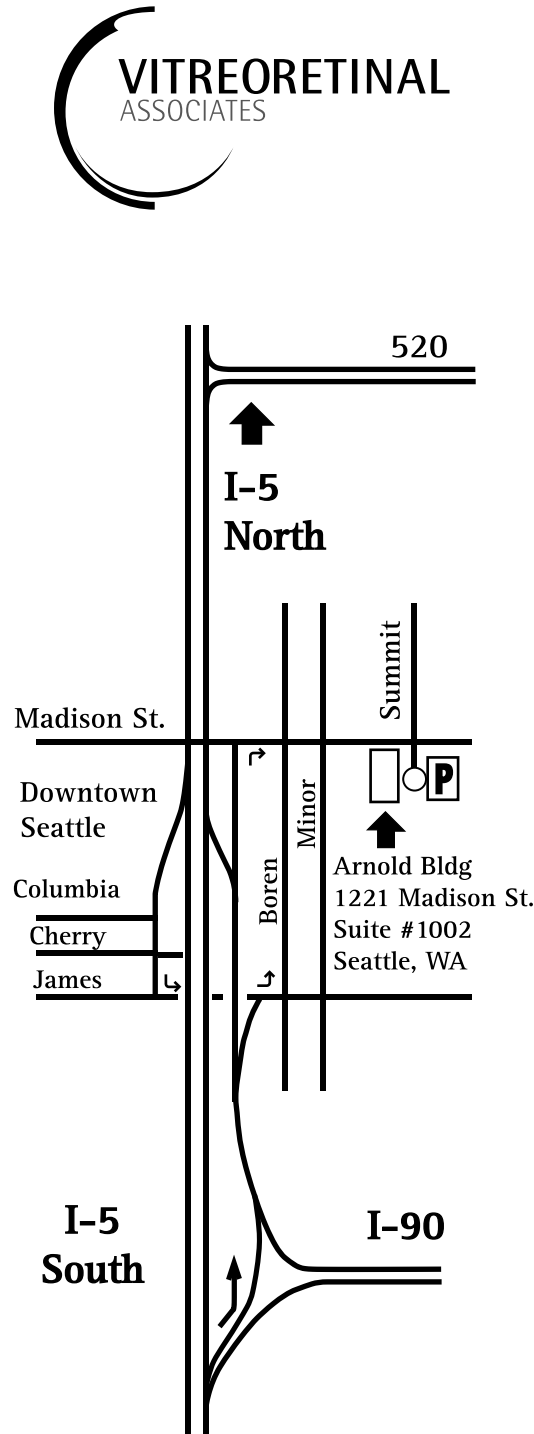
Parking garage entrance is at Summit and Madison.

Office Visits:

At your visit, we need:

Current medical insurance card

Insurance referral form from your primary care physician for diagnostic examination, testing and treatment anticipated.

Your present glasses

List of current medications & dosage

We are considered medical (not vision) for insurance

At each visit, your medical history is reviewed, your vision checked, and your pupils dilated with drops. You should consider bringing someone to drive you home after your visit. New patient visits may take more than 2 hours; follow-up visits take an hour or more. We have four doctors available, but occasionally your visit may be prolonged to allow one of us to attend to an urgent problem

Billing and Insurance:

We accept Medicare assignment and participate in most insurance programs, If your insurance requires a referral, please contact your primary care doctor and bring a copy with you when you come for your appointment.
